

**Natural Area** provides an interesting environment for park users while presenting a beautiful entry to Holbrook for southbound drivers.

**Planted Buffer** on both sides present an attractive prospect to viewers inside and outside the park, while strategically blocking undesirable views. Views would not be entirely blocked to maintain safety.

**Nature Trail** traverses the north half of the park, providing opportunities for walking, jogging, or resting on park benches. Fitness stations could also be added around the loop.

**Central Lawn** provides lots of open spaces for casual play or sitting, in either sun or shade.

**Park House** with restrooms and maintenance offices, centrally located for easy access by all park users.

**Picnic Plaza** provides a small space for picnic tables and general staging space related to the playground. It's located next to one of the two entries for an easy connection between playground and restrooms.

**Playground** with splash pad fits in perfectly here, and helps to activate this area of the park. This feature could be eliminated or made larger. It's placed close to the restrooms and parking, but away from the busy street.

**Parking** should fit into the design seamlessly, providing easy access to program elements while not causing a negative visual impact. This site could easily accommodate additional parking onsite or along the street.

**Union Avenue Entry** has been kept simple; a large panel of decorative grasses with lawn panels behind will provide a unique and beautiful front face to the park, with minimal maintenance implications.



**Planted Median** is an inexpensive way to extend the park beyond its boundaries - making the road more like a parkway.

**Low Berms** and strategically placed plantings provide an attractive backdrop for amphitheater visitors and block out traffic noise, while maintaining views of the structure from the street.

A **Bandshell / Amphitheater** would not only activate use of the park, but would also serve as a key architectural focus point from many points of view within the park and outside.

**Amphitheater entry** could be slightly more formal than the rest of the park to provide a setting for the architecture. In addition to the entry axis, we propose to encircle the audience area with decorative grasses, providing a sense of enclosure and connection to the site while not blocking exterior views into the area to maintain safety. Views toward the commercial area to the south would be screened.
